TSCEC Mini Enduro Series Supplemental Rules

- 25.0 <u>Applicability.</u> The rules contained herein are hereby added as a supplement to the TSCEC Official Rulebook and shall apply exclusively to the TSCEC Mini Enduro Series. The Supplemental Rules outlined below shall override any inconsistencies in the Official Rulebook in respect to the Mini Enduro Series.
 - 25.1 <u>Age Determination.</u> In addition to the Age Class determination set forth in Section 7.2 of the Official Rulebook, copies of official birth certificates may be requested for age determination for Mini Enduro participants where applicable or when a mini riders age is called into question.
 - 25.2 <u>Waivers.</u> A parent or legal guardian must sign a TSCEC Responsibility and Conduct Waiver, along with TSCEC Minor Release Forms prior to each race at each event. Each minor will also sign a Sportsman and Conduct Waiver prior to each race at each event, which will acknowledge the following:
 - NO PIT RIDING is allowed at any race for any reason. The child is only allowed to ride from camp to the course back. They are not allowed to ride at any other time. If the child is caught riding at any other time, they will be disqualified and the parent risk disqualification as well.
 - 25.3 <u>Schedules.</u> Mini Enduros for riders ages 3-14 and Women 15+ will be held on the Saturday prior to each TSCEC Championship Series Event. The hosting Club Member will elect if its event can facilitate a Mini Enduro, and, if so, shall include the start time and any other pertinent information on its flyer.
 - 25.4 Fees. All fees set forth in Section 2.0 of the Official Rulebook shall apply.
 - 25.5 <u>Motorcycle Legality.</u> All equipment must comply with Section 5.1 of the official Rulebook unless specified below.
 - 25.5.1 The hosting Club Member shall have discretion to determine if training wheels will be allowed. If they are allowed, the course shall be wide enough and smooth enough to accommodate the training wheels and allow for passing. In addition, the motorcycles with training wheels shall start last in their respective class.
 - 25.6 <u>Mini Enduro Classes.</u> The following Mini Enduro Classes supplement Section 7.1 of the Official Rulebook.
 - Beginner 6 Under
 - 7-9 with a maximum 14-inch front and 12-inch rear wheel
 - 9-11 with a maximum 14-inch front and 12-inch rear wheel
 - 9-14 with a maximum 19-inch front and 16-inch rear wheel

- Women's Beginner 15+
- Stacyc and/or Strider bike (class(es) may be added at discretion of the Club Member) Club
 Member is responsible for the on-site registration and scoring of said class(es).
- 25.7 <u>Downward Class Changes Prohibited.</u> Section 6.6 of the Official Rulebook shall not be applicable.
- 25.8 <u>Trail Marking/Length.</u> The following rules apply to trail marking at all TSCEC Mini Enduro sanctioned or co-sanctioned events:
 - 25.8.1 <u>Marking.</u> The hosting Club Member must mark the trail with surveyors' ribbon and arrows of a color that is most visible to the Mini Enduro Participating Members. Markings shall be placed where a rider on a smaller bike will see them.

25.8.2 Courses.

- A. Courses should be set up in the same manner as a regular enduro, although race courses for Beginner 6 Under and 7-9 are set up differently from the 9-11, 9-14 and Women's Beginner 15+ classes.
- B. The course is recommended to be between 2 and 3 miles in length. It is also suggested that a shorter course (.5-1 mile) be marked for the Beginner 6 Under class race. This can be done as a separate course, or a split-off of the main Mini Enduro trail. If a split-off is done, it should be staffed for the entire time that the participants are racing to provide them with trail direction.
- * A shortened mileage is recommended based on the probability of a 50cc being able to successfully negotiate the section without outside assistance.
- 25.9 Racing Formats. A lap race is recommended for both the Beginner 6 Under and the 7-9 classes. A sprint format is recommended for the 9-11, 9-14, and Women's Beginner 15+ classes, although a lap race format may also be used.
- 25.10 <u>Mini Enduro Rider's Meeting.</u> A Mini Enduro Participating Members meeting shall be held in accordance with Section 12 of the Official Rulebook.
- 25.11 Race Procedures. The following processes are required for the Mini Enduro Series.
 - 25.11.1 The Scoring Chairman shall furnish each participant with a rider number for the front number plate. The Scoring Chairman has authority to determine the number allocations.
 - 25.11.2 Numbers will be assigned first come, first served.

- 25.11.3 The targeted starting time shall be 1:00 pm on Saturday before the Enduro event unless otherwise stated on the event flyer.
- 25.11.4 The Mini Enduro Participating Member meeting will be 30 minutes before starting time.
- 25.11.5 Each race will be twenty (20) or more minutes plus a lap at the discretion of the hosting Club Member.
- 25.11.6 Each hosting Club Member may determine each race according to weather and time constraints.
- 25.11.7 Starts will be "live engine".
- 25.11.8 Club Members and the Mini Chair may group classes at their discretion taking into consideration the number of participants and safety. It is recommended that the 9-11, 9-14 and Women's Beginner 15+ classes not run with the Beginner 6-Under and 7-9 classes.
- 25.12 <u>Supplemental Scoring Rules.</u> In case of a tie, the participant with the fastest final lap wins. If there is still a tie, the participant with the fastest next to the final lap wins, and so on until the tie is broken. At least one lap will be scored with minutes and seconds to assist in a tie breaker. All protests must be made by the parent or legal guardian on behalf of their child. All other Official Rulebook provisions shall apply.
- 25.13 <u>Supplemental Disqualification.</u> In addition to the rules in Section 18 of the Official Rulebook, the following shall apply.
 - 25.13.1 A child may be disqualified due to the behavior of their parent or legal guardian.
 - 25.13.2 All issues should be taken up with the acting Mini Chairman, TSCEC Chairman or TSCEC Scoring Chair.
 - 25.13.3 Profanity and/or physical confrontation among parents, legal guardians or participants will result in immediate disqualification from the event, and possible disqualification for the year and series.
- 25.14 <u>Supplemental Awards Rules.</u> In addition to the rules in Section 23 of the Official Rulebook, the following shall apply.
 - 25.14.1 The top 5 finishers in each class will receive an award (trophy, plague, or medal)
 - 25.14.2 The top 5 finishers in each class will receive year-end awards if they have participated in 50% of the races.

25.14 <u>Miscellaneous Rules.</u> In the absence of a specific rule addressing a situation herein, the TSCEC Official Rulebook shall govern.

25.14.1 Sweep Riders.

- A. Sweep Riders for the mini course shall be no younger than 18 years of age to ensure the safety of the riders and the ability to properly aid in the start and/or removal of motorcycles from the trail.
- B. There must be at least three (3) Sweep Riders per course.
- C. All Sweep Riders for the Mini Enduro shall wear a safety vest, as well as have markings on their bikes and person.
- 25.14.2 <u>Worker Averages.</u> Mini Enduro Riders should be actively involved with the preparation of an Enduro weekend and will be given their average circuit score for the event they worked on with an Approved Worker Point form.
 - A. Riders in the Beginner 6 Under and 7-9 classes may ride their Club race and collect series points and trophy. Riders in the 9-11, 9-14, and Women's Beginner 15+ classes have the option to ride their race but will not be eligible for series points and trophy for that race. If they choose to ride their race, they will not be eligible for worker points.
 - B. All other worker average rules set forth in Section 22.4 of the Official Rulebook shall apply.
